Entre 1972 y 1977, además de mi actividad en el campo editorial, me dediqué al periodismo *freelance*. Colaboré en *Triunfo* (mis artículos y reportajes pueden consultarse actualmente en "triunfodigital.com"), *Destino*, *Tele-Exprés*, *Serra d'Or*, *Avui, Gaceta Ilustrada* y otras publicaciones de la época también desaparecidas, como *Economía Mediterránea, Contrastes y Punto y coma*. En la revista *Quimera* publiqué un trabajo sobre la correspondencia que mantuve entre 1977 y 1978 con Henry Miller.

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
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

element... Though I have left one reference to Florens's mother, at the end of para 4, otherwise it seems to me that the final para comes too much out of the blue. Hard to take in that it's a story of a mother/daughter if we don't know she had a mother... I've edited to make it flow, and I've also run on new last line into my last line, which seems to work.

Anyway, attached is the re-revised version, with your cuts made and other changes in bold. I'll pass this to Design now, but there's plenty of time to amend and correct further if you feel the mother should come right out.

Thank you SO much for your detailed critique and perfect rewrites. Not at all picky, in fact I feel mortified by my use of 'Indian' and freed slave, and can't think why I used the word plague for small pox when I it's perfectly clear (some kind of 'metaphorical' reading which ended up in my copy...)


I thought of Florens as wild (early on at least) because her mother calls her that - those shoes and her 'prettify ways'. How to suggest her timid yet seductive ways? So I decided best to cut the description and keep simply your/Lina's words 'with the hands of a slave etc' which say it all. I love that her feet are finally hard as cypress - brilliant! Yet somehow her mother's final cry also gives me pause... had she really learned? But then perhaps none of us ever really does...


I love too the myth of American individualism growing out of the end of 'family'. There are so many layers to this novel that one can go on and on uncovering. It is dazzlingly brilliant!

A powerful tragedy distilled into a jewel of a masterpiece by the Nobel Prize-winning author of *Beloved* and, almost like a prelude to that story, set two centuries earlier.

In the 1680s the slave trade was still in its infancy. In the Americas, virulent religious and class divisions, prejudice and oppression were rife, providing the fertile soil in which slavery and race hatred were planted and took root.

Jacob is an Anglo-Dutch trader and adventurer, with a small holding in the harsh north. Despite his distaste for dealing in "flesh," he takes a small slave girl in part payment for a bad debt from a plantation owner in Catholic Maryland. This is Florens, "with the hands of a slave and the feet of a Portuguese lady." Florens looks for love, first from Lina, an older servant woman at her new master's house, but later from a handsome blacksmith, an African, never enslaved.

There are other voices: Lina, whose tribe was decimated by smallpox; their mistress, Rebekka, herself a victim of religious intolerance back in England; Sorrow, a strange girl who's spent her early years at sea; and finally the devastating voice of Florens' mother. These are all men and women inventing themselves in the wilderness.

A Mercy reveals what lies beneath the surface of slavery. But at its heart it is the ambivalent, disturbing story of a mother who casts off her daughter in order to save her, and of a daughter who may never exorcise that abandonment.

Acts of mercy may have unforeseen consequences.
